Chapter 4. Rules Applying to All Public Institutions of Higher Education in Texas Subchapter B. Transfer of Credit, Core Curriculum and Field of Study Curricula

- A. Foundational Component Areas with Content Descriptions, Core Objectives and Semester Credit Hour (SCH) Requirements. Each institution's core curriculum will be composed of courses that adhere to the content description, core objectives, and semester credit hour requirements for a specific component area
 - I. Communication (6 SCH).
 - (A) Courses in this category focus on developing ideas and expressing them clearly, considering the effect of the message, fostering understanding, and building the skills needed to communicate persuasively..
 - (B) Courses involve the command of oral, aural, written, and visual literacy skills that enable people to exchange messages appropriate to the subject, occasion, and audience.
 - (C) The following four Core Objectives must be addressed in each course approved to fulfill this category requirement: Critical Thinking Skills, Communication Skills, Teamwork, and Personal Responsibility
 - II. **Core Objectives**. Through the Texas Core Curriculum, students will prepare for contemporary challenges by developing and demonstrating the following core objectives:
 - (A) Critical Thinking Skills: to include creative thinking, innovation, inquiry, and analysis, evaluation and synthesis of information;
 - (B) Communication Skills: to include effective development, interpretation and expression of ideas through written, oral and visual communication;

- (C) Empirical and Quantitative Skills: to include the manipulation and analysis of numerical data or observable facts resulting in informed conclusions;
- (D) Teamwork: to include the ability to consider different points of view and to work effectively with others to support a shared purpose or goal;
- (E) Personal Responsibility: to include the ability to connect choices, actions and consequences to ethical decision-making; and
- (F) Social Responsibility: to include intercultural competence, knowledge of civic responsibility, and the ability to engage effectively in regional, national, and global communities

III. Semester Credit Hours Required: 6 SCH

B. Institutional Assessment and Reporting

Each public institution of higher education shall evaluate its core curriculum through the assessment of the core objectives on an ongoing basis, reporting the results of the assessment to the Board every ten years on the schedule that accords with the institution's accreditation reaffirmation self-study report to the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools or its successor. The evaluation and report must include:

- (A) a description of the assessment process for each of the six core objectives;
- (B) an explanation of measures, methodology, frequency and the timeline of assessment activities;
- (C) the criteria and/or targets used to benchmark the attainment of the six core objectives;
- (D) the results of the assessment, including evidence of the level of attainment targeted and achieved for each of the six core objectives;
- (E) an analysis of the results, including an interpretation of assessment information; and
- (F) any actions planned, including how the results and analysis of the assessment process will be used to improve student learning and achievement.
